This program, will prepare graduates for a career in the construction industry. Graduates may find employment in residential, industrial, commercial and civil/heavy construction sites.



- 6-month program from April to October 2015

This pre-apprenticeship program will provide students with the foundation for a successful career in the construction industry. Graduates may find employment in residential, industrial, commercial and civil/heavy construction sites, where they will perform entry level tasks on various projects.

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY:

- Age 17 to 30 years old
- Grade 10 High School or equivalent
- Preference will be given to high school graduates (Gr. 12), women, and Aboriginal peoples, however, all interested youth are encouraged to apply
- Completion of an application process that includes a resume and letters of reference
- Eligible applicants must also complete a mechanical reasoning test, an academic upgrading assessment and attend a personal interview

The program includes 6 weeks of academic upgrading and trade-readiness training, followed by 12 weeks of trade skills curriculum, and an 8-week paid work placement within the construction trades. The program begins March 30th, 2015 and ends October 9th, 2015. Successful applicants will receive financial support for tuition costs, books, tools, and supplies. Space is limited.
